THUNDER PENCIL & WORD SPORTS CHALLENGE

- Thunder Pencil partners schools with theatre professionals to introduce pupils to the fundamentals of writing plays.
- Word Sports Challenge is an engaging and challenging program designed as a day of intense literacy and language development the whole school can enjoy.

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THUNDER PENCIL INFO

Working in groups the children take part in a fun, fast paced script writing workshop to produce a short play which is rehearsed by the our theatre practitioners and performed at the end of the same day, giving the children a voice and a public experience of success.

Our project explores new ways of working with language, encourages creativity and develops literacy.

WORD SPORTS CHALLENGE INFO

This program is based on the much-loved word play and word game books by Erica Bentel – Has a Book Got a Spine? & Can You Crack Them? Both recommended reading on the WA Premier's Summer Reading Challenge list.

Word Sports Challenge develops and supports the following areas of literacy education:

• Phonemic awareness

Spelling

 Reading comprehension

Word – sound

- Use of active and passive vocabulary
- awareness Critical reading skills

In addition it helps pupils of all ages build motivation, curiosity, attention and memory; creating a positive association with books and reading and enhancing fluency.

WORD SPORTS CHALLENGE Classes get to move through 5 fun and interactive stations, each with a different literacy focus. Each station is facilitated by an author, poet or actor whose presenting skills allow pupils to fully engage with the puzzles, games, creative and lateral thinking exercises, as they discover the fun they can have playing with words and using language.

The program is inclusive and designed to appeal to all including; visual/spatial thinkers, children with autism, those with dyslexia; reluctant readers, gifted and talented pupils and ESL students.
